### Concerning Future Policies of University of Miyazaki Related to COVID-19

The nationwide state of emergency declared in Japan on Thursday, April 16 is set to expire on Wednesday, May 6. The information provided below indicates the fundamental policy the University of Miyazaki will take in a case where state of emergency for Miyazaki Prefecture is lifted, so please understand the content in advance. A separate announcement will be made for the Kiyotake campus so students of the Faculty of Medicine should follow those instructions. Please be aware that additional measures may be taken for certain faculties or departments, so please follow the specific instruction of your faculty or department. Policies may be subject to further change depending on the situation for the state of emergency, so please periodically check the university website for the latest updates.

Health self-monitoring, contacts <b>(important)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Students must check their temperature and physical condition every day; any student with a fever of over 37.5°C or who feels lethargic and lacks a sense of taste or smell should contact the student services section of his or her faculty and also input the necessary information in Check Sheet 2</li></ul>	
Classes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Online classes begin from Monday, May 11</li><li>All face-to-face classes (including tests) are suspended</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>In principle, online classes to begin from Monday, May 11</li><li>Some face-to-face classes may be held if appropriate measures taken</li></ul>
Preparations for online learning	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Some faculties will provide students with their system ID and explain online learning on May 7 and 8 (Thur. and Fri.)</li><li>Depending on the particular subject, there may be face-to-face meetings between May 11 and 15 (Mon. to Fri.) to explain online learning etc. (for all students in common)</li></ul>	
Student services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Student services will be suspended if the state of emergency is extended</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Student services will be resumed the day after the state of emergency is lifted (or on the next weekday if the emergency is lifted on a holiday)</li></ul>
Campus entry	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>In principle, students are not allowed on campus (exceptions are if students do not have adequate wifi access at home for online learning or if they need to purchase textbooks)</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>In principle, students are not allowed on campus except if they do not have adequate wifi access at home for online learning or need to purchase textbooks, or have to participate in a face-to-face</li></ul>

Extracurricular activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All on-campus activities are suspended</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All on- and off-campus activities suspended for the time being</li> </ul>

Job-hunting activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students should refrain from travel and limit themselves to online activities (even for Miyazaki Prefecture)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• For the time being students are in principle not allowed to leave the prefecture</li> </ul>
Trips outside the home, visiting hometown, travel	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students should not only refrain from traveling to their hometowns but also limit their trips outside to necessary errands for their daily life</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• For the time being students are now allowed to leave the prefecture to travel or visit their hometowns, and should avoid the “3 Cs” (closed spaces, crowded places, close-contact settings) when going outside.</li> </ul>
